### External Validation

Our school's External Validation will be held this Thursday from 8am-10.30am. We will meet with the Principal School Leadership and Peer Principal to discuss our school's programmes through the lens of the School Excellence Framework.

### Screen Time Survey

At the University of Technology Sydney, they are running a national research project into parenting, children's screen time and their development. They would like to work out how parents use screens with their children and how to use them to get the best outcomes for their children.

They are recruiting parents of children between the ages of **4.5 to 6** year olds to complete two-part online survey, which takes 20-30 minutes to complete at each time-point.

They are partnering with schools day-care centres and community groups, in order to generate guidelines and recommendations that could be used in school for educational purposes,

and navigating device use in other contexts, e.g. recess/lunch.

Moreover, they hope to generate an understanding of the implications of handheld screen time to the teaching and broader community, in order to enable students to engage in a productive learning environment and shape strong development.

Participation is voluntary. You have the right to withdraw from part, or all, of the project at any time. This proposal has been approved by the UTS Human Ethics Research Committee (HREC#: ETH18-2354). Please see the attached flyer for more information.
