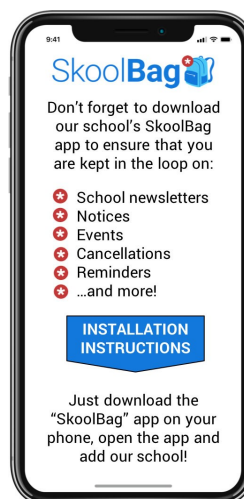
Cost is \$5 per child. Families pay for first two children only.
