Some crafty Stage 3 students have been meeting for a Craft Club at lunchtimes this term.

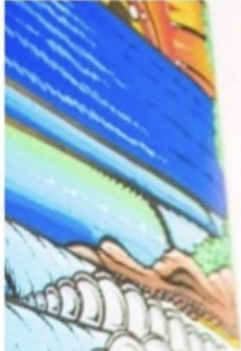
So far we've made twisted cords, button whirlers, beaded bracelets and pillow boxes.

Next term Craft Club will be for Stage 2 students.



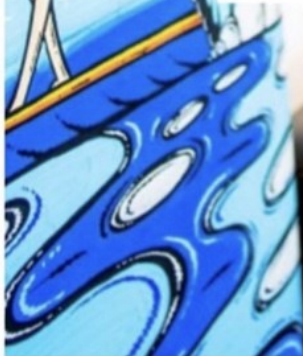

<b>Dave's Rave - STICKING TO THE BASICS AND GETTING THE JOB DONE!</b> At the time of printing we are all reeling from the information overload of both a State Election, as well as a Federal, occurring one on top of the other within an 8 week period. This "Sydney based problem" does not, and has not, existed in our region since 2005. Funnily enough we, at Community OOSH, fixed that problem 15 years ago. Basically, what is not happening, is proper industry consultation, with the right people, who put the best interests of you and your children 1st and politics 2nd! We are hoping, now that the dust is settling, that there will be real progress in delivering functional, workable and viable Childcare that delivers the best for the kids!
