Today will see our 4th Zoom meeting around the planning and analysing data for the LEED project. This links to the new **School Improvement Plan** that will commence in term 2 next year. All schools will have the same Strategic Direction 1 which is called **Growth and Attainment** where all schools look at improving literacy and numeracy data. Next term we will survey students and parents in regards to specific questions around School Culture, Reading and Numeracy and Wellbeing to assist with our planning.

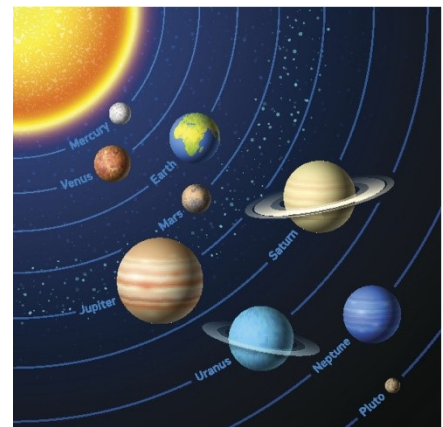

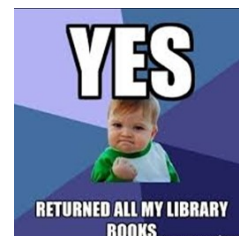

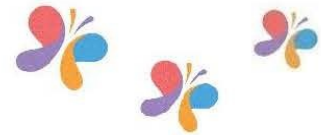

FEES: Depending on the Child Care Subsidy (CCS) and activity hours a parent is entitled too, the out of pocket costs to parents can range from a few dollars to the full rate shown below. The table below shows the full fee with no Child Care Subsidy along with an example of the out of pocket expense where the highest rate of Child Care Subsidy is applied.
