The additional state-wide \$383 A million investment in the COVID In Intensive Learning Support Program (COVID ILSP) means we can continue to provide targeted small group m tuition for students with the greatest learning need throughout 2022, in response to learning disruption ar

The primary aim of the programme is to boost educational outcomes and ensure students are on track in their learning, recognising the difficulties that all students and school communities have faced during the pandemic. In 2020, students in NSW learned from home for 7 weeks. In 2021, many students will have been learning from home for about twice as long.

We should receive notification of our funding allowance towards the end of the term.

School camps and excursion

Under the current restrictions, schools operating under Level 3 are not permitted to hold excursions, field trips or camps. Therefore, we have made the very tough decision now to cancel both our Stage 2 and 3 camps that were scheduled for later this term.

We understand that many students and parents will be very disappointed. However, we will plan a fun week of activities at school later in the term for both Stages 2 and 3.

Refunds will be available and more details will follow once activities have been organised and finalised.

Assistant Principal Curriculum and Instruction (APCI)

All schools have also been notified of an additional allocation to employ an Assistant Principal Curriculum and Instruction. This is for an initial 3-year period and the successful candidate will be employed as a permanent member of our staff.

The Assistant Principal, Curriculum and Instruction position is a leadership role dedicated to ensuring that literacy and numeracy knowledge and skills are embedded in curriculum and assessment; high quality teaching practices are enhanced; and the capabilities of middle leaders are strengthened in literacy and numeracy instruction.

The new role shares the broader educational imperatives of the Assistant Principal position but with an explicit focus on the leadership of effective, evidence-based literacy and numeracy teaching and assessment practices for improved student learning outcomes across the curriculum.

The Assistant Principal, Curriculum and Instruction provides high support and guidance to enhance teacher growth and development in literacy and numeracy and strengthens schoolwide instructional capabilities across the curriculum for middle and senior leaders.

Applications for this position at our school close tomorrow and we are hopeful of interviewing candidates in the next couple of weeks.

Stage 3 News...



If your child will be five years of age before 31st July, 2022 you can enrol now for Kindergarten in 2022. The school will be running a Kindergarten orientation program during Term 4, 2021.
